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1. Call to Order

Joe Halko called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m.

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2. Changes or Adjustments to Agenda

None.

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19 3. **Programming Report-** Paul Snyder provided the programming report. With Paul 20 Snyder doing the job of 3 people, the shows are still being recorded and scheduling is 21 going well. This is a very busy time of year for Northwest Access TV and hope to hire 22 staff members soon, but really wants to make sure the staff are a good fit. Town Meeting 23 day is coming up in March and it is a very busy day. The Messenger and NWATV are 24 both understaffed- Richard Copperwaith and Michelle Monroe are on board with covering 25 Town Meeting Day. Paul Snyder is sitting down with Michelle Monroe on Wednesday of 26 next week and will hopefully have enough help with coverage. NWATV will be covering 27 6 or 7 Town meetings on March 3rd, 2020. This has always been a busy time for sports, 28 then the sports teams head into Post Season with playoffs and all teams are doing very 29 well in Franklin County. NWATV is moving forward with the Vermont Bucks and their 4 30 games at the Complex this summer. The VT Bucks are looking for sponsorship dollars to 31 help cover the fees- this season is held indoors in the hockey rink and begins in May. 32 Northwest Access TV is looking for promo stuff and will have complete broadcast rights.

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- 4. **Treasurers Report** Mike Curtis explained that he got all the Financial Reports from Paul Snyder, and NWATV is following their Financial Management documents. All financial safeguards are in place. Mike Curtis would like to get more clear financial reports for the Board members to see, and easier for them to read. NWATV's gross
- 38 income for the month was \$37,000 compared to last year there was a \$3,000 increase
- primarily due to the North Country Income. Under the expenses they noticed the electrical charge is up significantly from last year- this is due to a double payment.
- 41 Payroll has a \$5,800 variance which is due to accrued vacation time that was paid out to
- 42 Zach Scheffler and Elizabeth Malone. The Balance Sheet is very strong they have about
- 2.5 times the current assets to the current liabilities. In the checking account, they have
- almost \$400,000 worth of free cash which would cover 1.5 years of expenses. \$40,000
- 45 was allocated for the server. NWATV is looking swell. It was asked about prepaying the
- 46 mortgage to reduce the total monthly payments, the mortgage has an excellent interest

rate, but it is not a bad idea. Mike would like to know more about where Comcast is going, and what the reduction would look like should there be one before paying too much onto the principal of the mortgage. The check detail should be part of the Treasurers Report with very tight financial controls.

Tim Stetson made the motion to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented; Virginia Holiman seconded the motion. The motion carried 6-0-1. Mike Curtis abstained.

5. **Executive Director's Report-** Paul Snyder reported an extra expense this month was made to purchase lapel microphones that attach to clothes as the old ones needed to be replaced. Vermont Access Network will have a VT access TV channel what will be a state wide channel; in Franklin County the channel will be 1070. Paul Snyder joined this committee and they are still in the planning stages, including whose programming is going up on the channel and how is it being monitored. This VT access channel was agreed upon by Comcast and the CPG. Currently, there is no news as to who is monitoring the channel but will be a volunteered run channel. Paul Snyder will let the Board know further information as he hears it. The VAN Comcast Contract- in an effort to make sure no AMO spoke for themselves, VAN created a contract that would help cover 90% of the contract. The Channel changeover to 1079 and 1089 will take place no later than March 26, 2020. Paul Snyder will be in the process to change advertising and rebrand the graphics. These new channels have a hope to become HD channels in the future. This would be a great upgrade for NWATV as all their equipment is in 4K. Gracenote partnered with Comcast for the channel lineup-logistics are still a little complicated and more involved, there is a lot of data sending. Quite a few AMO's have postponed a month, and Paul Snyder will follow the lead which will also save some money on maintenance fees. The search for the technology and programming coordinator are still in progress. An offer was made for the technology coordinator, they have more interviews for the programming coordinator scheduled.

Mike Curtis made the motion to accept the Executive Directors Report as presented; Bryce Batchelder seconded the motion. The motion carried 7-0-0.

6. **New Business**

a. **Staff Hiring Update-** An offer was made to the Technology Coordinator. They are still interviewing for the Programming Coordinator. Paul has been in his current position for a month. Marty has been great with editing. Roger has been free to do all the studio shows. Zach Scheffler's last day was January 2, 2020. The Board would like to help and support Paul Snyder as much as possible throughout this whole hiring and vacant position process.

b. **Financial Policy Change**- Mike Curtis explained that Elizabeth Malone had a company credit card with Capital One. Years back, Capital One changed their rule on Corporate Cards and therefore it needed to go to Elizabeth Malone's

name. Becky Stebbins who works at Peoples Trust Company does not issue corporate credit cards. Currently the credit card is used for smaller purchases and Amazon. Mike Curtis suggested getting a debit card off the checking account. The bank has a \$2,500 daily limit for this debit card which they could request an increase if needed. NWATV would open a new account that could pull money from the main checking account. Peoples Trust Company has a great fraud unit. The Board would be able to track a separate account for the debit card, and they would set a monthly max. With a debit card they would lose out on rewards.

Mike Curtis made the motion to open an additional checking account with Peoples Trust Company, for the purpose of the issuance of a debit card to be used by the Executive Director; seconded by Tim Hurlbut. The motion passed 7-0-0.

c. **Peoples Trust Company Banking Resolution-** This item will be tabled and Mike Curtis will bring back an updated financial policy.

When Elizabeth Malone worked for NWATV she would bring receipts and invoices to the accountant for processing as it was on her route home. Paul Snyder entertained the idea of having one of their employees drop this stuff off on their way back to college. It was brought up that if they employee got into an accident then NWATV would be liable. The cost for Green Mountain messenger is \$60.00. If Paul Snyder sends documents to the accountant he can send them next day with tracking via the mail. Moving forward he will mail it with tracking as they mail the documents back to NWATV.

d. **Public Comment-** None.

7. **Old Business- As needed.** None.

8. Approval of Minutes- 1/6/20 and 1/20/20

The minutes of 01/06/20 will be presented next month.

It was asked to remove Zach Sheffield from the minutes of January 20, 2020 as he resigned on January 1, 2010 and was not at the Board meeting.

Mike Curtis made the motion to approve the minutes of January 20, 2020 as amended; Wesley Kempton seconded the motion. The motion carried 7-0-0.
