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1. Call to Order

Joe Halko called the meeting to order at 5:09 p.m.

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2. Changes or Adjustments to Agenda

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20 3. **Treasurers Report** – Mike Curtis reported he was pleased with the last Treasurers Report. The Profit and Loss from this year to the previous year shows the income remains 22 steady and if this trend stays, NWATV will be on budget. The gross profit is up \$4,000 23 which is primarily due to the North Country income from Comcast. Payroll is down 24 \$11,000 in comparison from last year; this gives net income a surplus of \$56,000 YTD 25 which is over the last 4 months of the year. Mike Curtis explained there are not big 26 numbers that are jumping out, and everything looks well. Paul Snyder is managing 27 expenses well. The balance sheet shows the assets and liabilities from last year and this 28 year, the checking account has \$422,000 while the mortgage has \$511,000 remaining with 29 5 years to go. The appraised value of the building is a half million- Mike Curtis would 30 like to make a \$50,000 lump sum payment to the principal of the mortgage. With the goal to put \$50,000 down each year for the next 5 years. Mike Curtis suspects the banking 32 industry will change within the next 5 years, and it would be good to reduce the mortgage 33 over the next 5 years. Each year, roughly \$17,000 of the mortgage payments gets paid to 34 the principal. At the end of the 5 years with paying the additional \$50,000 to the principal 35 the mortgage should be down to \$150,000. NWATV did apply for a PPP loan which will 36 add more money to the Cash Reserves. In order to have the loan to be forgiven, 80% of

the loan needs to be payroll costs. They received \$37,000 and hopefully they can spend

- 45 currently low, and if we reduce the mortgage by over \$100,000 in the next two years it 46
 - will be more pleasing to the bank. They are paying about \$18,000/year in interest. There

are loan fees, and they could do a modification of loan fees or a note- but currently it does not seem logical right now, and they do not know what the interest rates will be next year.

Michel Consejo made the motion to accept the Treasurer's Report and checks issued as presented; Tim Stetson seconded the motion. The motion carried 7-0-1. Mike Curtis abstained.

4. **Programming Report-** Roger Lindla explained they have been doing reruns of their archived material and educational programs due to lack of live programming. They will hopefully have some in studio programming next month. They are taking advantage of the new multi-camera shoots; this is improved and a viewer is able to follow clearer. The downside to online programming is some of the Boards are not comfortable with the technology some are trying to plow through it, some have given up and cancelled meetings as much as they can. NWATV picked up Montgomery and Bakersfield's meeting, generally they would not be able to cover these meetings. The team is talking amongst themselves to keep the programming stream vital, and they think it would be best to monitor and assign videographers to meetings as they feel comfortable. Channel 16- Alan is downloading, editing and reuploading State meetings which have a turnaround time of about 1 day. Programs are being posted on the Carousel bulletin board. Librarians are jumping onto YouTube and Facebook and they are using microphones and cameras to enhance their videos. NWATV has been in contact with the producers of the videos and has put them on their channel. Some new potential content for NWATV includes a chef who would like to do cooking shows. A local educator has brought a proposal for door to nature series. There is a yoga therapist who has recorded 8 videos. The St. Albans museum responded to a virtual tour, and Rodger has not yet heard back on that. Paul is looking to help the local Superintendents to cover graduation content this year. St Albans Town and Highgate select board pay NWATV a quarterly stipend, beginning July 1 they lock into contracts with Select Boards and School Boards. It was asked to check in and verify if a videographer could replace a stenographer; Paul Snyder will look into this.

5. **Technology Report-** Alan reported they are rolling out with the new channels, including uploading the State house committee meetings. Roger and Alan have been working to add Holy Trinity Church to their meeting listings. A new show they have is Inside Groove Racing Specials- which is a live stream with virtual drivers. The Channel Guide is now live on the TV Guide channel. They are still working on making the guide effortless. Audio Video Corps will come on May 26th and May 27th for the installation of the new server. Alan is working with John from Audio Video Corp to get whatever done remotely before they show up with the new server.

6. **Executive Director's Report-** Paul Snyder explained they received their Q1 check from Comcast this week. The first installment to Audio Video Corp was made. VOSHA Training- all employees have submitted their VOSHA training in regard to COVID19, and they sent Paul Snyder a certificate and staff will

incorporate these guidelines in the workplace. Many Executive Directors do not know when they will have staff back in their work places. They are starting to see some Boards wanting to come back into the Public eye. All the Executive Directors will discuss later this week. Currently NWATV is planning with the 4 high schools what graduation will look like. Enosburg and Richford have the same planeach student will walk in to receive their diploma individually. BFA has yet to divulge what they will be doing, but they will be getting back to Paul this week. MVU will be doing something like Enosburg and Richford. Alan, Rodger and Paul may split up to cover all of these ceremonies. The VAN meeting had over 60 people on the video call. Kevin Christopher is stepping down from VAN, and Rob Chapman was voted into the position. Elizabeth Malone was awarded with a VAN embroidered glengarry bonnet. The annual report is due by the end of the month.

Marilyn Grunewald made the motion to accept the Executive Directors Report as presented; Bryce Bachelder seconded the motion. The motion carried 8-0-0.

7. **New Business**

a. **COVID-19 Open Discussion-** Paul Snyder explained as an open discussion they would like to slowly open back up. Paul has been back in the office, with Rodger. Richard Copperwaith has been doing shows at NWATV, they came in through the doors- went into the studio all without touching anything and did a show. This was safe for them and the employees. Some people from the community did a memorial service including the Pledge of Allegiance, a prayer, and the people came in one by one for each of their sessions. There was no physical building touching- and Rodger wiped things down. They will figure out what precautions they can take- but so far, they have been able to let some people into the building. It is up to each producer if they want to enter the building. NWATV does not have gloves, but they do have masks on hand. The staff have been using personal masks- which they use in the halls, and talking to each other in the rooms. Paul will make a check list this week as to what should be done in order to enter the building.
