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- 1. Call to Order
- Joe Halko called the meeting to order at 5:05 p.m.

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- 2. Changes or Adjustments to Agenda
- It was asked to add Event Advertising under New Business.

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- 3. **Treasurers Report** Mike Curtis was unable to attend so Paul Snyder explained
- 21 the Balance Sheet was showing over \$2 million in assets. NWATV is beginning to pay
- down the mortgage loan at a more aggressive rate. Paul Snyder is doing great keeping
- NWATV on budget and is keeping expenditures in line and shows they are in a strong
- 24 position. The utilities have been a little more expensive because the electricity has
- increased substantially for the last two years especially with the AC. Paul Snyder is
- 26 experimenting to see where the fine details are making such a difference. Paul Snyder
- 27 receives a weekly email on Wednesdays, from Green Mountain Power saying the usage of
- power for the previous week, this will help to remedy where the power is being drawn the most.

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- Michel Consejo made the motion to approve the Treasurers report and Checks issued,
- Marilyn Grunewald seconded the motion. The motion carried 8-0-0.

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- 34 4. **Programmers Report-** Rodger Lindala was unable to attend the meeting. In his
- 35 report, he explained they are playing local legacy programs, and soon they will return to
- 36 regularly scheduled times. People are being cohesive. Alan recruited a home
- improvement show, there will be a show on Yoga with Nicole Rodger who was producing
- 38 before COVID hit. Rodger is working with a Chef and producing local cooking shows.
- 39 Recent outreach with towns, teachers, churches- they have been broadcasting for these
- 40 meetings- each show will choose for best broadcast. They are recording local community
- 41 PSA's. Teachers have also been offered to produce lessons for students, this will be in
- 42 either a physically distanced group or 1 on 1 learning. Burlington Church Mass was
- replaced with St. Johns in Enosburg. 2020 luminaria relay for life will also be produced.

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- 45 5. **Technology Report-**. Alan is working in the studio and was unable to attend.
- Paul reported the Home Improvement show will be with Chandler Edd the shows are well

- done and they are looking to make a few episodes before they begin airing. They are back
- 2 to 3 shows a week in the studio. September 9th will be open registration for Northwest
- 3 Nightmares, and this year the screening will be 100% digital and tickets will be sold via
- 4 Pay Per View style. This opens a lot of doors with prerecorded videos and sneak peeks.
- 5 Alan will be giving the local creators with studio demos (tricks and treats). NWATV can
- 6 use their video converter to stream to the laptops to stream out- which is working great for
- 7 the hybrid meetings. They have microphones for better audio. If they can get the
- 8 Northwest Nightmares on a big screen, then they will switch over to that method, but with
- 9 COVID it is uncertain.

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6. **Executive Directors Report-** Paul Snyder explained they received their quarterly money from Comcast, and it was up more this quarter which other access stations have seen dips. Statewide COVID help for COVID Relief funds is getting put together for VAN- NWATV may be eligible for \$19,000 in COVID relief funds- Paul has a meeting tomorrow on the specifics. Bryce Batchelder liked the postcard campaign- they were able to get the advertising funding and all the information they wanted on the postcards. Bryce who lives in Franklin got a postcard. Contract work- Paul is working with NMC to do a provider tour for new providers coming to NMC. This was a way for providers to take a tour of the hospital over a 12-minute video. Another contracted video will be COVID-19 where were you and how did you respond. Fall sports- Paul reached out to Dan Marlow at BFA- and was encouraged by Paul's initiative. For the fall they would cover a few matches and would provide the videographer from NSN to cover Friday nights. Due to Gov Scott's ruling they have different guidelines so the games will change- 8 to 10 home games for soccer and possibly 4 football games. Global Net provides cell data via satellites- for a small fee they would provide service and it would be subscription. NWATV would need to get an extender to reach all the fields and it would cost around \$500 to \$600 per year. Paul explained if they wanted to suspend service, they could opt in and would need to pay a smaller monthly fee- but you can't use the service. Global Net is not able to cover MVU, Richford or Enosburg, so this gives an option for BFA only. Dan Marlow explained the Boosters would most likely be more than willing to pay for this yearly plan. NWATV received a remote origination site settlement which was \$20,000 and could use this how they see fit- this would be a great use with the money for this.

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Wesley Kempton made the motion to approve the Executive Directors Report, Bryce Bachelder seconded the motion. The motion carried 7-0-0.

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a. **Public Comment-** None.

sponsor it would wash the funding out.

b. **Event Advertising-** Joe Halko explained he does not benefit, but he does represent the organization that is putting this event on. The Rotary Club is hosting a Lucky Ducky Days on the evening on September 10, 2020 at the fountain in Taylor Park which is the 5-year anniversary of the ladies being restored. Each year in March the St Albans Rotary hosts the Home Show- and this year it was cancelled

due to the pandemic. The rotary was a big contributor of the ladies being restored. If people are interested, they can buy a duck and all the ducks will be placed in the fountain and there will be 24 lucky winners from a \$1,000 prize to baskets of \$100 each. There will be lots of winners- and NWATV could sponsor and the event if they wish. Sponsorship would be \$250 and it would give everyone the opportunity to share the sponsor information to give NWATV another opportunity to get their name out there and get people talking about their new numbers and raise awareness. Paul Snyder wanted Joe to present this to the Board and would like the Board's input. They have an advertising budget, and so far, this year they are under budget. Paul can decide if he wants to sponsor or not.

8. Old Business

a. **Equipment Policy Overview**- Paul Snyder explained he was crafting an equipment policy and wanted to simplify this policy if he included in two places- in the producer sponsor form and in the Employee Handbook. It would encompass what a Full Time Employee would use and nothing about the Broadcasting equipment- and has an Equipment policy if the equipment is not needed by the community. If you are not an employee, you cannot receive financial compensation while using the equipment. The Board commended Paul on editing the policy NWATV already has.

Marilyn Grunewald made the motion to approve the policy as discussed; Michel Consejo seconded the motion. The motion carried 7-0-0.

b. **Annual Meeting Discussion**- Paul was going to look in the bylaws and see if they could have the annual meeting virtually. Marilyn Grunewald suggested to change the bylaws for down the road so they have the complete flexibility to vote over the web. Tim Hurlbut will look at the bylaws and will let the Board know what needs to get changed. Next month they will look to change the bylaws if they need to.

c. **Board Member Nominating Committee-** Last month they mentioned 3 individuals have terms ending for renewal- and these would be 3-year terms. Mike Curtis, Tim Stetson, and Wesley Kempton will be up for renewal if they want to renew. All 4 of the Board positions are up for renewal as well (President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer). Joe Halko would like to know if all three of them would like to reup for the next 3 years; Wesley and Tim would like to continue on the Board, they will check with Mike Curtis.

d. **COVID-19 Update-** Paul Snyder explained they are operating status quo. Producers have been positive with the procedures. Paul is stocking up on sanitizer and videographers are doing more monitoring rather than picking up and attending meetings. NWATV is covering more meetings, and have been able to add Fairfield, Montgomery and Bakersfield's Town Meetings and would like to continue to

1 stream their videos. Paul Snyder and staff are checking temperatures when people 2 enter the building. 3 4 **Scholarship Overview-** They had 2 scholarships in the past Stan e. 5 Beuregard/Larry Dugan Scholarship which was two \$1,000 scholarships. Students had to submit quite a few documents to apply. The Paul Legassey Memorial 6 7 Scholarship was given to Dan Marlow to nominate an individual for this 8 scholarship. They would like to expand this scholarship to hit on the Cold Hollow 9 Career Center, Enosburgh High School and Richford High School. A coupe of 10 Board members will investigate what they would like to do, how much they would 11 like to devote, what they would like changed and added.
