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36 37 6. **Executive Director's Report**- Paul Snyder explained he has yet to find a major credit card company where the credit would not be tied to Paul Snyder's credit. Paul reached out to his own credit card provider, and they approved him for enough funds for a larger purchase to be reimbursed quickly. This scenario will come into play soon as Paul needs to purchase Alan a new computer which would be a few thousand dollars. By opening a new credit card, it is another inquiry on your credit, and Paul's financial advisors also does not think Paul should be doing this. The place they would like to purchase the computer from, does not allow Purchase Orders and requires a credit card payment. Paul inquired to Trademark Inquiry and asked if their logo or name was trademarked, and NWATV is not trademarked. Eric Benson explained TM or SM (Trademark or Service mark). The studio is in the process of being repainted, the company they are using had some COVID scares, they have 1 more day of painting before it is done. Landscaper has been by and is the same person who does the outside maintenance in the winter and spring. There are many ruts in the dirt from plowing, but he will fix. NMC and Dept. of Health- NMC continues to supply these videos and working with Erin Creely for future. Per Tim Hurlbut- NWATV is now displaying they are a Corporation. New Board rollout- Fairfield, Montgomery, Bakersfield, and Berkshire. Everyone wants to meet in person- slowly adding videographers back into the in-person rotation. Sports wrap up was almost done at the last meeting for the winter. Paul was successful with their promise, 47 out of 48 days were live. The 48<sup>th</sup> was the Boys Championship game and that was because they were not allowed to go into the arena. 1st year of live sports-Rodger, Alan and crew did a great job- they excelled with recording all these games. If you get a chance, history of sports broadcastinglongest episode 1 hr 20 minutes- it is also possibly it will be available on the County Courier's website. Typical season is about double the number of games. Some teams had shortened seasons. Enosburgh and Richford recorded their own videos and NWATV was able to then take the video immediately after the game finished and put on their website. The game schedule its typically December through March, and this year it was February and March.

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Michel Consejo made the motion to accept the Executive Directors Report as presented; Bryce Bachelder seconded the motion. The motion carried 6-0-0.

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## 7. New Business-

a. **Interactive Programming Guide**- Paul Snyder explained there is a fluid concern. He does not have all the answers yet and is still waiting to hear from Gracenote. Paul is looking for guidance or opinion from the Board. There has been

some talk with Executive Directors; Gracenote who provides the service is going to be raising the rates from \$103 to \$500 per channel. People have reached out to the Comcast Representatives, but have not heard anything. Some access centers have already seen the price increase, and some have not seen this. They could go from paying \$2,400 to \$6,000 a year. If it does not go up they are fine. If it does go up, does the Board feel NWATV should continue with this service. Is there a reason to not pay \$12,000? If NWATV does not continue with service, NWATV's name will be on the channel listing, but the show name will not appear. NWATV is not comfortable with paying that much money. Bryce recommended negotiating with Gracenote. Does Gracenote want to be hosting NWATV? Megan O'Rourke explained they got confirmed word that going forward they are looking to charge \$250/month if the channel is static, and \$500/month for a changing channel. From what Paul understands, Gracenote is the only service. \$500/month for the program names. Paul Snyder is going to check to see if they cannel Gracenote what will happen? Joe Halko expressed he should reach out to Melissa at Comcast and see if there are any other vendors they could use.

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## 8. **Old Business-**

a. **Comcast Contract Renewal Update-** Paul Snyder explained he has not heard back from Melissa. He has sent 2 emails and left 2 voicemails recently and has not received a response. Paul Snyder is hopefully NWATV will be able to have a signed renewal contract with Comcast.

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b. **COVID-19 Protocol Update-** Paul Snyder explained everything is going smoothly with equipment pickup at the studio, but he had some questions. When it comes to vaccinated versus unvaccinated. Does NWATV require proof of vaccination, or can they even ask for it? Do they create their own policy that mandates simple procedures until the state has theirs? Following state rules and guidelines- does this change for an unvaccinated person? If they have 5 vaccinated people, could they remove their masks? Is there a way they could pay their staff when staff is missing hours due to the vaccine? Mask-still required until July then goes to recommended (own policies give you the option in July- to save themselves they should follow state guidelines and recommendations). It is not a violation of HIPPA asking to see their vaccination card. The state recommends wearing the mask and can stay as a policy inside the premises. If individuals are in an inside space and they are not family members, they need to continue to wear masks. Paul can deal with it on a per case basis- Paul will continue to move forward with payment for each of them- they will not need to use paid leave time.
